SUBJECT: WHY I AM RUNNING

"Duty, honor, country: Those three hallowed words reverently dictate what you ought to be, what you can be, what you will be. They are your rallying point to build courage when courage seems to fail, to regain faith when there seems to be little cause for faith, to create hope when hope becomes forlorn."

This is a quote by General Douglas MacArthur that all cadets at the US Air Force Academy are required to learn and recite during times of great mental and physical duress throughout our four-year military training. It is demanded on us so that in the harshest of times and darkest of days we will still remember our purpose. It is a calling that stays with us even after we put away our uniform, a calling that will stay with us until death, and it is this calling why I am writing to you, my fellow Ohioans, to explain the inciting incident spurring my run for Congress.

Our Founding Fathers in the framing of the Constitution, demanded that the military must always be above politics. While the military must always act under civilian leadership, as officers, we were tasked to ensure, as an institution, it would never be used as a partisan tool. When we take our Oath of Office, we do not swear an oath of loyalty to a king, a candidate, or a political party, but to the Constitution. At a time of extreme political polarization, at a time when public trust in traditional institutions is eroding, this solemn oath to the Constitution has allowed us to keep the military untarnished in the eyes of all Americans.

Indeed, after I left the military, I believed that it was in good hands cemented by our oath and reinforced by the continuing education at the service academies for future officers to internalize the significance of this oath. And I never questioned this conviction until that fateful day of January 6, 2021.

"Duty, Honor, Country" – the unbeliever will say these are mere words, a slogan or a flamboyant phrase but they are words that are the bedrock of every American's character; they make us strong when we are weak, brave when we are scared, proud and unbending in defiance against the threat of failure. They urge us not to seek the path of comfort but spurn us into action against the stress of the challenge in standing up against the storm. And, my dear reader, a storm is what we are in the midst of today.

RESTORE THE AMERICAN DREAM

To see the likes of Ashli Babbitt, a former USAF Airman, resort to rioting and intimidation in an armed rebellion against her own government made me cast doubt on this conviction. Seeing General Michael Flynn, a once-respected US Army officer, slowly descend from OEF/OIF war hero, to Russian agent giving aid and comfort to our enemies – enemies who would strive to kill our servicemen and servicewomen deployed around the world, to finally a full-on domestic terrorist seeking to tear apart the foundations of our government that many of us have fought and died to protect, shattered this conviction to the core. When our very own Bill Johnson, a fellow USAF officer, was complicit in this attack on our nation's Capitol, it made it personal.

These Americans swore an oath; an oath to defend against all enemies both foreign AND DOMESTIC; an oath that they violently broke on January 6th. I am not an unreasonable man. Those who know me, know I wear my heart on my sleeve. I try to be as sympathetic as I can to all Americans and, in this light, I do not blame Ashli Babbitt. She was never an officer and her oath was to "follow the orders of the President and the orders of the officers appointed over me." It was THAT President and THOSE officers of the Republican Party who infected and corrupted the American people with their lies and propaganda. It was THAT President and THOSE officers of the rand others like her to assault the People's House and ultimately sent her to her death. This I cannot forgive nor can I forget.

Yet when it comes to politics, there are some things I can forgive. As a reasonable person, I understand that often in the course of governing, our Representatives have to "keep up appearances" and kowtow to the party line or to the President when of their own party. And if I am elected, if you choose me to represent you, through my solemn oath to "Duty, Honor, Country," Ohio will once again captain our great Nation to a new era of Prosperity.
